- Septic Maintenance Ordinance. One of the goals of the Comprehensive Plan for the Village of North Barrington is to manage, conserve and protect the water resources of the Village in order to provide high quality surface and subsurface waters to serve the community needs. As you know, the Village has adopted a Septic Maintenance Ordinance to help educate homeowners regarding their septic system, prevent or detect failing systems and reduce the risk of contamination to the water resources within our Village. To view a copy of this Ordinance, please click here. The Ordinance is meant to be phased in over time in order for homeowners to be able to comply without undue hardship or cost. Homeowners will be notified when they are requested to provide information regarding the maintenance of their system via a letter from the Village. If you're planning on conducting maintenance to your system prior to receiving your notice please keep a copy of your receipt and any results as this will provide beneficial.
- Private Well Class. A free online course that helps homeowners understand and care for their water well is being provided. Use caution before you dump those old products left on the shelves down the drain, especially if you have a septic system. Avoid dumping old paints, harsh chemicals, medicine or any other products that will kill the bacteria in the septic tank. These products may also end up in your groundwater!
